Come Early and Stay Late By Pastor Dennis Norby

For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God (1 Corinthians 1:18).

I recently read an article entitled, "Make the Most of Sunday Mornings," in which the writer, Matt Smethhurst, spoke about what he called two small changes that he thought would help people make the most of their Sunday mornings. He wasn't making any miraculous claims and wasn't aiming to put more burdens on anyone for which I am thankful. He simply desires to encourage a couple of changes to help us receive from God more of the gifts He desires to pour out to us. Smethhurst called the two suggestions 1) Come hungry, leave full and 2) Come early, stay late. I would like to summarize a few of his thoughts and share some applications for us.

When the author suggested, "Come hungry, leave full" he was really encouraging us to come ready to hear the preached word. He had two points to help in this, the first was to simply be in prayer for the preacher and yourself as a listener as you gather to hear God's Word. The second was to know the text that was going to be preached. This struck me because one of my favorite parts of the week is our Saturday Men's prayer time when we go over the text that will be preached the following day. I make preparations throughout the week, and it is a great blessing to talk through that text with others on Saturdays. I am greatly blessed as well because as we go through the text, I know that a number of men are not going to come to worship "cold" the next day. They will have been thinking about the text and its meaning and will be able to receive God's Word in a powerful way because they have already been meditating on the passage. So, men, I would invite you to come to our Saturday Men's prayer time. It is a great blessing. Even if you are not able to come, please note that each week we have the texts for the following Sunday listed in the bulletin. Take a look at them. Read them; meditate upon them, it will be a blessing to you when you gather with others to hear those words preached on Sunday morning. In addition to that, I am hoping in the new year to try and make it a regular

practice to have some type of regular format for sharing those passages with you. Stay tuned for more information on that.

The second point, "Come early, stay late" was an encouragement to arrive early so that the craziness of the morning, often filled with frustrations and delays, will not cause you to miss part of the service or to feel rushed as you arrive. The stay late portion of the article encouraged people to stick around and visit with the people you have just worshiped with and to take time to talk about what you just experienced together. To speak about the message, the music, the encouragement you received from being together. The author rightly noted in his article the strange phenomenon that we often gather to worship and hear God's Word but then feel awkward talking about what we had just seen and heard. Even though we just experienced it all together! I would add the encouragement that the stay late idea can and should be extended to speaking about the worship service after you have left, with your friends and family you are with. Sometimes people have joked that the Sunday meal shouldn't be "roast pastor." The idea being that it can be a time to complain about this point or that in the sermon or for failing to remark upon something. I suppose that could be a problem if people are simply looking to tear things apart, but I don't worry about that necessarily. Honestly, I would rather there be a serving of "roast pastor" than to not talk about the word that has just been preached. As you have the opportunity, speak about God's Word after the service. It will help you cement in your mind God's truth and clarify, correct, or emphasize something you heard in the message. What a great opportunity for iron to sharpen iron (Proverbs 27:17).

So then, I pray that you might consider these couple of changes or adjustments so that you might receive and enjoy more of the gifts that God desires to deliver to you. 

Services are also archived on our website.




AFLC Ministry Focus for January
